DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM:

The County Board of Education by agreement with the County's Juvenile Probation Department provides educational programs and services to youth who are under the jurisdiction of the Juvenile Justice System. In addition, the county community school serves expelled youth, SARB referred youth and others as referred by local school districts. Emphasis is on academics, a structured environment, and positive feedback of results that encourage student success.

Teachers will collaborate with staff from school sites, the Probation Department, and community agencies for problem solving student behavior management and family intervention; negotiate and maintain a behavioral management program balanced with strong academic requirements; operate a self-contained classroom within curriculum frameworks and standards with an emphasis curriculum appropriate for at-risk students; and work toward the goal of returning the community school students to regular school programs.

ESSENTIAL JOB TASKS:

- 1. Designs and implements an appropriate curriculum and lesson plans for at-risk middle school students focused on academic standards for individualized and group instruction
- 2. Assesses individual students to determine present level of academic performance, as well as social and emotional needs
- 3. Uses a variety of instructional materials and learning aids, including the use of technology to enhance student learning
- 4. Establishes and maintains standards of student behavior needed to achieve a functional learning atmosphere in the classroom
- 5. Organizes the classroom to create a safe and optimal learning environment appropriate to the needs of middle school students
- 6. Evaluates students' academic growth, keeps appropriate records, and prepares progress reports
- 7. Performs basic attendance accounting, monitors student attendance, and prepares records and reports as required
- 8. Works closely with County Probation staff, social service agencies, and administration
- 9. Works with the SERVE coordinator to provide community service opportunities
- 10. Serves as a community school student advocate
- 11. Maintains professional competence through participation in in-service education activities provided by the office and/or self-selected professional growth activities as approved by the Coordinator of Student Programs
- 12. Collaborates with teachers from students' district of residence to transition students into and out of the program
- 13. Meets with parents and other community resource personnel to develop an appropriate program for each student
