Basic Functions:

Under the direction of the directors of Curriculum and Instruction and Special Education, provides professional development, support and guidance as to the incorporation of research based specialized strategies and methodologies into the broader development and execution of district wide curriculum and instruction practices; coordinates the implementation of a Multi-Tiered System of Support framework TK-12, and supports site leaders and teachers in delivery of differentiated, culturally responsive instruction for diverse learners including English Learners, Students with Disabilities, Low Income students, and Foster and Homeless Youth

Credential, Education and Experience:

- Hold a valid California Education Specialist teaching credential w/English Language Learner authorization
- Master's degree from an accredited college/university (preferred)
- Completion of five years of effective special education classroom instruction

- Components and requirements of the IDEA regarding Least Restrictive Environment (LRE)
- Specialized approaches and methodologies regarding delivery, presentation of, and access to, curriculum to ensure each student can meet the VUSD educational standards that apply to all children

- Effective professional development, program evaluation, and adult learning theory
- Universal Design for Learning and culturally responsive teaching to address the issues of race/ethnicity, identity, language, poverty, and culture

- Train, model, coach, and support teachers in the use of the student data system for frequent formative assessments, progress monitoring, and the use of data to guide instruction
- Assist schools in developing strategic plans for intervention and growth for all students in alignment with the district Local Control Accountability Plan
- Provide assistance to school leaders in analyzing California Dashboard Data to prioritize academic, socialemotional, and behavioral support for diverse students including English Learners, Students with Disabilities, Low Income Students, and Foster and Homeless Youth
- Customize, prioritize, and facilitate professional development in Universal Design for Learning and MTSS based on student need
- Work closely with other personnel in the Education Services Division to integrate Common Core State Standards (CCCS), Next Generation Science Standards, and technology for high quality teaching and learning

Demonstrates proficiency in:
