Job Description:

Under the direction of the Director/Principal of VACE, provide instruction both online and on campus to students in the Back Office Medical Assistant program. Teach one-on-one and in small groups. Monitor and assess student performance, grade student work and tests, and develop curriculum.

Evaluate, counsel, and instruct adult students in an open-entry/open-exit program. Assist students in gaining proficiency in all aspects of medical back office procedures.

Qualifications:

- 5 years of experience working as an RN, LVN, nurse practitioner, physician's assistant or medical assistant. Or... a bachelor's degree with at least 3 years of experience working in the field
- Must possess or have the ability to qualify for an Adult Education Designated Subjects Vocational Education credential in Health Occupations.
- Experience teaching multi-level vocational classes preferred.
- Training and/or experience in the following: Individualized instruction, competency-based education, curriculum development, student counseling, and the use of student contracts.
- Possession of the academic background and interpersonal skills necessary to meet the diverse needs of adult students.
- Working knowledge of keyboarding, word processing, computer operating system, email and internet research, and Google Forms.
- Ability to teach basic medical terminology, anatomy/physiology, medical systems, exam procedures, pharmacology, clinical lab techniques, medical law/ethics, medical therapy procedures, CPR, standard first aid, venipuncture, and medical insurance billing.
- Ability to teach skills in related allied health care fields (C.N.A., pharmacy technician, and phlebotomy) preferred.
- Bilingual ability in Spanish preferred.
