Our Multi-Tier Systems Support (MTSS) Team serves all students, including across all disabilities (mild, moderate, and severe), through an innovative approach that includes coaching and deep partnership with our general education partners, integrated special education (ISE) partners, school leaders, and related service providers. To best serve our Rocketeers and meet their needs, we work to serve students across all areas of need: academic, social-emotional, and behavior.

The Mental Health Provider Clinical Supervisor will be a key strategic leader, and a critical contributor to the realization of the vision for the Mental Health Provider role at Rocketship Public Schools. The Mental Health Provider Clinical Supervisor will provide clinical supervision to Rocketship's Bay Area team of mental health providers, support the execution of the vision for social-emotional and behavioral services within Rocketship, support schools in the execution of compliant practices related Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS), and support the implementation of high quality behavioral and social-emotional interventions in schools.

The Mental Health Provider Clinical Supervisor reports to the Manager of Mental Health Providers. They will provide clinical supervision to up to 6 Mental Health Providers. This position requires current Licensure in California as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT), or Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor

(LPCC) with a minimum of 2 years of successful licensure and in good standing, and completion of supervisory courses to supervise registered ASWs/AMFTs/APCCs.

Essential Functions

- Provide clinical supervision and guidance for a high performing team of mental health providers toward supporting schools and school leaders in ensuring exceptional outcomes for students with unique learning, social-emotional, and behavioral needs; model and sustain a culture of high performance and service orientation among team members.
- Implement and oversee execution of Rocketship's vision and approach to social-emotional and behavioral services, serving always as a model of meaningful inclusion and contributing to Rocketship Education's standing as a continued leader in the field for effective, efficient and high-quality services for all students, including those students with special needs.
- Identify and secure resources that support the mental health needs of Rocketeers.
- Identify and provide development for the clinical therapeutic skills of mental health providers.
- Support the vision for social-emotional supports across all tiers including goal setting, executing, and progress monitoring.
- Support the consistent implementation of evidence-based behavior and social-emotional interventions amongst mental health providers.
- Design and lead weekly individual and group supervision for mental health providers.
- Meet with and collaborate weekly with Managers of Mental Health Providers on supervisee needs, feedback, next steps, and professional development.
- Ensure compliance of mental health provider hours, documentation, and needed credentials.
- Ensure the MTSS Team is viewed as positive supports to the organization's mission that are fully aligned with Rocketship's Core Characteristics (Innovation, Pursuit of Excellence, Authenticity, Community, and Tenacity), and not as bureaucratic obstacles to serving the needs of the students.

Qualifications:

- Required: Current Licensure in California as a Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT), or Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor (LPCC) with a minimum of 2 years of successful licensure and in good standing.
- Required: Completed supervisory courses to supervise registered ASWs/AMFTs/APCCs
- PPS credential (highly preferred)
- 5+ years experience as School Social Worker, School Marriage Family Therapist, or similar position (highly preferred)
- Supervision experience
- Experience working with elementary-age students in a school setting (highly preferred)
- Experience working with students with a range of disabilities (learning disabilities, emotional and behavioral disorders, autism, etc.)
- Familiarity with special education, IEP team participation and educationally related mental health services and the delivery of such services (highly preferred)
- Commitment to Rocketship's special education inclusion model and overall mission to close the achievement gap within our lifetime
- Familiarity with socio-emotional learning competencies, trauma informed education practices, multi-tiered systems of supports (MTSS), and restorative practices a plus
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Strong organizational skills as demonstrated by the ability to effectively manage multiple tasks
- Ability to be flexible and adaptive in a fast-paced, dynamic work environment
- Ability to work as part of a multidisciplinary team and with a diverse population of clients
- Perform a variety of specialized and responsible tasks: maintain records, establish and maintain cooperative working relationships with students, parents, other school personnel, meet schedule and compliance deadlines
- Possession of a valid California driver's license: willingness to provide own transportation in conduct of work assignments as you will be required to travel from site to site to work with students and faculty at all sites (mileage reimbursed)

Physical Demands:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this position. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the functions. While performing the duties of this position, the employee is regularly required to talk, hear, and communicate with both adults and children. The employee frequently is required to use hands or fingers, handle or feel objects, tools, or controls. The employee is frequently required to stand; walk; sit; and reach with hands and arms. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds and occasionally climb ladders. Specific vision abilities required by this position include close vision, distance vision, and the ability to adjust focus. The noise level in the work environment is moderate to high.
