JOB DEFINITION:

The Mental Health Therapist works with youth and their families to provide highly skilled psychological casework services, counseling and treatment for identified students in the school setting. The School Mental Health Therapist will also provide consultation services to the school staff to support the overall mental health goals of the school within the district's adopted Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) and Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework.

SUPERVISOR:

School Principal and/or Assistant Principal School Mental Health Clinician

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

To perform the job successfully, an individual must be able to satisfactorily perform each essential duty. EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

Essential Duties:

- Interviews students and families and compiles social case histories.
- Maintains regular contact with the parent/quardian of each client (if appropriate)
- Completes treatment plans, treatment plan updates, consent for mental health services authorizations and all documentation requirements
- Prepares behavior plans
- Interprets and explains factors pertaining to mental illness
- Refers students to appropriate agencies and cooperates with other agencies in collaboration treatment
- Conducts group therapy as necessary
- Consults with school staff regarding school-wide behavior supports
- Identify and provide intervention strategies for children and their families, including case management and crisis intervention
- Coordinate Parent Education Opportunities
- Coordinate, collaborate and consults with Positive Behavior Intervention Team members.
- · Attends related meetings and trainings as appropriate
- Provide relevant staff with trainings on how to provide district adopted social emotional learning curricula in the classroom
- Participates in the collection of mental health information and student outcomes data to be used for monitoring the overall performance and effectiveness of services provided
- Provides complete and timely documentation to support services rendered

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Essential Duties: continued

- Participates in PBIS Tiered II supports for students with identified attendance, behavioral and emotional challenges aligned to the school's Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) and Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework
- Serves as member/consultant to the assigned school's MTSS and PBIS team
- · Other duties as assigned

Other Related Duties:

 Performs other related duties as may be assigned by the assigned School's Principal and/or Director of Social Emotional Support

PHYSICAL EFFORT AND WORK ENVIRONMENT

- Physical, mental, and emotional stamina to perform the duties and responsibilities of the position.
- Mental acuity to collect and interpret data, evaluate, reason, define problems, establish facts, draw valid conclusions, make valid judgments and decisions.
- Manual dexterity sufficient to write, use the telephone, computer, calculator, and office machines at required speed and accuracy.
- Vision sufficient to read handwritten and printed materials, and the display screen of various office equipment and machines.
- Hearing sufficient to communicate in person and hold telephone conversations in normal range (approximately 60 decibels).
- Speaking ability in an understandable voice with sufficient volume to be heard in normal conversational distances on the telephone and addressing groups.
- Physical agility to sit, stand, kneel, walk, push/pull, squat, twist, turn, bend, stoop, and to reach overhead.
- Physical stamina sufficient to sustain light physical labor for up to 8 hours, sit and/or walk for prolonged periods of time.
- Physical mobility sufficient to move about the work environment (office, district, school site to site) for sustained periods of time on hard flooring, climb slopes, stairs, ramps, and to respond to emergency situations.
- Physical strength sufficient to periodically lift and/or carry 25 pounds of materials or supplies.
- Occasionally push and/or pull a variety of tools, equipment, or objects weighing 80 or more pounds.
- · Typically indoors work environment.
