Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Teaches knowledge and skills in physical fitness, health education, and individual, dual or team sports to students.
- Instructs students in citizenship, basic communication skills, and other general elements of the course of study common to all teachers, as specified in state law and administrative regulations and procedures of the school district.
- Analyzes, demonstrates and explains basic skills, knowledge, and strategies of formal sports, games and fundamentals of body movement.
- Provides individualized and small group instruction in order to adapt the curriculum to the needs of each student, to the extent feasible.
- Provides for the safety of the student:
 - Instruct the proper handling of equipment and playing area.
 - To check daily on the need of equipment repair and playing area safety.
 - To report any unsafe or potentially hazardous condition to department chairman.
 - To supervise the passing of students from class area to shower area.
 - See that all equipment is properly recovered and returned to storage at end of each class session.
- Provides activities of student choice giving opportunities for the development of leadership, creativity through game modification, and to help evaluate progress.
- Provides frequent situations requiring practice of fair play, when winning or losing.
- Provides activities that are modified to overcome fatiguing factors as time, speed, distance, and pressures to win-to learn when to stop.
- Provides competition in a variety of activities that involve a wide range of skills and organization.
- Provides every student a opportunity to be participating member on the types of teams that challenge his interest and ability.
- Continue to improve physical educational professionalism by:
 - Attending clinics.
 - Attending California Association of Health, P.E., recreational and dance.
 - Serve on faculty committees.
 - Be aware of other department problems and know these teachers too.
 - Make suggestions of improvement in curriculum to department chairman.
 - Keep a gracious working relationship with custodial staff by written notices to department chairman when an area or equipment needs custodial attention and insure proper use of floors and areas.

Qualifications:

Education & Experience:

- Bachelor's degree including all courses to meet credential requirements.
- Student teaching, Internship, or full-time teaching experience.
- Valid California Single Subject Preliminary or Professional Single Subject Clear credential or eligibility to obtain above based on out of state certification, that authorizes services in subject area.
- Must hold authorization to serve English Learners/CLAD or BCLAD.
- The teacher preparation program may be completed concurrently with employment under special circumstances, if approved by the District (internship).

Working Conditions:

- Primarily outside environment, some classroom environment.
